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The College of Arts and Sciences has two ongoing training opportunities for anyone teaching a course in higher ed. Both courses are self-paced and asynchronous. The courses are open to anyone who teaches in the College of Arts and Sciences, including graduate teaching assistants and adjuncts. Course 1: Intro to Online Teaching (~ 4 hours)

This course can benefit anyone who teaches online, but you may find it especially useful if you have:

- Never taught a university course online before.
- Only experienced online teaching in a rushed situation, such as during the pandemic.
- Taught online but would like a refresher on pedagogical fundamentals.

After completing the course, you should be able to:

- Describe the many roles of an online instructor.
- Explain the importance of getting to know your students.
- Create rich opportunities for engagement and connection.

Course 2: Fundamentals of Online Course Development (~ 8 hours)

This course is designed to inform instructors of the high-quality standards that CAS has for its online courses. It provides tips and strategies to prepare a well-organized, engaging, and robust online course. This training will be beneficial whether you are designing a new course completely from scratch or are redesigning an existing course.

After completing the course, you should be able to:

- Set up a course in Canvas that is well-organized and easy to navigate.
- Apply the principles of accessibility and inclusivity to create a welcoming online community for students.
- Determine ways to increase student engagement and interaction with course materials.
- Identify various technology tools for creating course content and enhancing the students' learning experience.
- Identify various methods for evaluating students' mastery of the course content.
