Dr. Min Jung Kim (Applied Strings Faculty)



Min Jung Kim received her DMA at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, where she previously earned her Master of Music Education degree and many awards, including the Paul Rolland Memorial Violin Competition Award as a winner in 2016. She received full scholarships throughout her entire master's and doctoral programs. She was the only violinist awarded the Cooke Fellowship in 2018-2019, based on her outstanding performance at the audition. Min Jung is listed as a certified violin teacher in the Paul Rolland String Pedagogy Society after completing four years of training. She has been teaching violin using a curriculum centered on the Rolland, Suzuki, and Zweig pedagogies. She has taught violin, chamber music, and ensembles in many diverse settings, including pre-college programs, string camps, and public schools since 2006.

As a dedicated and actively engaged researcher in music education and string teaching, she published her articles in the String Research Journal and American String Teacher Journal in 2022 and 2023. She also presented her research at numerous conferences, workshops, and seminars, including the American String Teachers Association, Illinois Music Education Conferences and Webinar Series, and Paul Rolland String Pedagogy Workshop.

Min Jung is currently teaching at Oklahoma Baptist University as an adjunct professor of violin and a preparatory academy violin instructor. As an active performer, Min Jung also serves as a section-first violinist at the Oklahoma City Philharmonic.
